VOLVO OCEAN RACE LEG 3 ABU DHABI-SANYA

The great race continues whilst we have been enjoying the summer break. Vestas Wind ran aground on a reef in the Indian ocean causing million dollar damage. As I write this (Australia Day) Vestas which had been loaded onto a ship and taken to Kuala Lumpur in December is now about to arrive in Genoa in Italy where Vestas will be rebuilt so to resume the race at Leg 8 in Lisbon. Best of luck to the Cast and Crew with that one. I am sure "Thy will be done".

Team Brunel was first over the line in Abu Dhabi on December 13, 2014 followed by Team Dongfeng, Team Abu Dhabi, Team Alvimedica, Team Mapfre and finally Team SCA.

With a three week break January 3 dawned in Abu Dhabi in very foggy conditions. With a incident free start it was off through the Strait of Humoz bound for Sanya on China's Hainan Island.

The route takes the race through the northern Indian Ocean passing under India and Sri Lanka where the land mass caused much wind shadow. Then it was on to the Straits of Malacca which separate Malaysia and Indonesia. So often the fleet was becalmed here with the anchor on board ready to send over the side when the vessels were going backwards due to current. Then it was on through the very narrow Strait of Singapore where the fleet had to compete for space with many & varied large ships. Once through the Strait it was keeping an eye on the coastline of Vietnam to Port and the hundreds of Vietnamese and Chinese fishing boats to Starboard or worse paddling past your bow. The response from the fishermen in their small boats was often quizzical and astonishment as many had never seen the likes of the Volvo fleet before in their backyards. Fishing boats were not the only distraction; fishing nets and general debris got caught around keels and rudders.

I do wonder if the fishing boats with so many crew actually had a proportionate number of life jackets or even a raft. In the final days of the race the fleet said Goodbye Vietnam & headed for Hainan.

A colourful ceremony greeted each boat as it arrived in Sanya on January 27th. China's Dongfeng was first over the line followed respectively by Abu Dhabi, Alvimedica, Mapfre [2 mins ahead], Brunel, last but not least Team SCA. February 8th the fleet sail for Auckland. "City of Sails".

Apart from the hope of catching some interesting action, the odd capsize moment or piece of excitement, as a photographer you soon become aware of the different personalities out on the water. There are the extroverts, who put on a good show for me, the shy ones who try to slide past without drawing attention, the grinners and the ones who spend the day grimacing!

It is always entertaining, though sometimes a change of course would be nice! I also enjoy catching the launch and retrieval moments, which at Keppel Bay tend to be a bit more exciting than most places, as well as the interaction between sailors. There are technical challenges besides keeping the camera dry.... And I have to say the investment in a Think Tank Rain cover has been invaluable for the preservation of the equipment! Shutter speed, ISO, Aperture; trying to focus when I am up and they are down!

The volunteers from Keppel Bay Sailing Club did a fantastic job managing the regatta; very much appreciated by the Impulse sailors and families. PCSC had 6 representatives sailing, a great turn out for a relatively small dinghy fleet. There is probably a book in it!




