

CLUB REPORT

Secretary Manager Brian Dawson

The trading year for your club finished 31st May 2013 so it's "that" time again. It's time to spend a week with the Auditor, it's time to do annual reports, it's time to hold an AGM and it's time to call for nominations to members for Management Committee positions.

Notice of the AGM is up on internal notice boards and it's up on the web site. It's also in this issue of Straphanger. Nominations forms for committee positions are at reception, main bar, on the web site and again in this issue. The nomination (ballot box) is at the bar under camera.

The clubs trading for the 2012-2013 year was on budget, we beat it by a lousy \$24k. At one stage we were miles ahead of budget but the wheels fell off the town in January & February, then it took until March to get rolling again and we have kept rolling up to now. Currently the club is trading as expected and breath is being drawn again. They tell me next January will be different due to deadlines on the island so if it's as good as January 2012 we'll be a doing well.

Turnover was a staggering \$212k above budget, which is huge, but labour costs were uncontainable blown out by \$156k. Yeah sure the revenue side was higher than the wage blow out, but the percentages were out of wack. In general I would like to see 3:1 revenue to wages but the cost of hiring labour in this town went through the roof last year.

It's more than just an hourly cost of labour to consider, it is the cost of living for the people working at the club. They need to earn enough money to live in Gladstone or they won't stay. So we need to balance off time needed to serve customers with dollars needed for the staff to survive. Hopefully this pressure will ease a little on the staff in 2013/14 with rents dropping, having said that it won't ease on the club as there's an industry pay increase and an increase to superannuation.

Needless to say some staff love it at the club and stay for a while. Take Janene Burraston for example, she has been here 10 years in June 2013. Originally employed by Marina Hobbs, with the difficult portfolio of Payroll and Accounts, Janene has been quietly working away in the office doing more than just her job description. Janene is made from old school hard stuff, she never takes a sickie, is always on time and knows more about the club than most people.

Janene has been expertly supported by the clubs Bookkeeping Accountant (CPA), Sue Kelly, who has been at the club for 14 years. I bet there's a lot of members who don't even know these two exist, yet they turn up every day and get the job done. They also don't know that during periods when the club was in transition periods between managers, Janene did her dandiest to ensure the club kept going. Well done Janene and Sue, on behalf of the Committee, Members, Management and Staff thank you for doing what you do.

More financial information will be available in the annual report which will be released just prior to the AGM, which is scheduled for 24th July 2013 at 1900. Please make yourself available to attend.

A couple of jobs that needed immediate attention are now under way, including an upgrade to the main power board. With the current load exceeding the incoming power, surges and power outs have been occurring in the middle of busy trading. Below are a couple of pictures to show the progress of some works.

Race Briefings

Everyone who will be on the water that day must attend the briefing. The briefing is another important avenue to communicate our courses, start/finish lines, travel to/from the course area, shipping and safety procedures. The intention is to be strict with attendance.

Race Nominations

Reminder paperwork will be required for 2013-14 race nominations.

Yacht Owners need to provide:-

A copy of your yacht insurance policy confirming public liability (min \$10,000,000) and race risk insurance.

A copy of your yacht registration certificate from Queensland Transport.

A copy of completed safety compliance check list as a minimum "YA special regulations equipment audit form – Category 7" or a higher category depending in which race you participate (Cat 4 and 5 for Fairway and Tripod)

Dinghy Owners need to:

Provide a copy of your boat insurance policy confirming public liability (min \$10,000,000). Be open to an inspection to ensure safety equipment complies with the YA Special Regulations, Part 2 (for Off the Beach Dinghies). See pages 305-310 Racing Rules of Sailing 2013-16.

You should have all documents available when you sign on and pay your fees, otherwise your race nomination cannot be accepted.

Notice of Race 2013 Pleiades Plate

13th & 14th July 2013 on the waters of Gladstone Harbour and Colosseum Inlet

1. Rules

This event will be governed by the current rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2013-2016, the Special Regulations of the AYF, and the Sailing Instructions.

2. Schedule of Events

- 2.1 Briefing: All interested members MUST meet in the Race Office at 1900 on Wednesday 10th July for a race briefing.
- 2.2 Cruise in Company: Leave the vicinity of A8 at 0915 Saturday 13th July, aiming to enter Colosseum Inlet at approximately 1130. This is not a race, and participants may sail/motor to ensure they arrive by the designated time.
- 2.3 Race: 'Around the Buoys' race inside Colosseum Inlet. Start 1400
- 2.4 Social: All participants are invited to
 - Dusk, Saturday 13th, a Pizza Evening Meal and bonfire on the beach
 - 0800, Sunday 14th, a BBQ Breakfast

3. Sailing Instructions

Sailing Instructions and Course co-ordinates will be available at the briefing.

Should the weather be deemed unsuitable to enter Colosseum Inlet, the venue will be changed. This will be decided at the briefing.

- 4. Safety
- 4.1 Yachts (Monohulls, Multihulls & Trailables): This event is classified as AYF Category 5.
- 4.2 Off the Beach Boats: This event is NOT suitable for 'off the beach' dinghies.
- 4.3 Runabouts: All runabouts must meet the Queensland Transport safety equipment requirements for small craft in partially smooth waters.

Runabouts not travelling with the fleet are responsible for their own safety. It is strongly recommended they log on with VMR Gladstone on Channel 82.

4.4 Charts: All boats must carry the Queensland Boating Safety Chart, Capricorn Coastal Series. 'Gladstone' (CC1), or Gladstone Harbour (PC1).

Any member wishing to drive to the venue are advised that Wild Cattle Island now has a locked gate on the access road. Please contact Paul Hayes (details below) to make arrangements for access.


