

Sailing Committee: is responsible for all things sailing resulting in the organising and running of club sailing events and regattas.


Straphanger Editor: - this role, within the Sailing Committee canvases articles, writes the From Your Sailing Committee page and proof reading.

PLEIADES PLATE - A HISTORY

John Joseph started construction of a 48' Van De Stadt Tasman in the early 1990s after first building the tools that would let him roll aluminium plates into the complex curves of her hull. She was launched in December 1999 and named Pleiades.

The Joseph family sponsored a harbour sail in early 2000 before John and Helen took Pleiades to Sydney to be their base while attending the Olympics. Upon return to Gladstone the first Pleiades Plate event was held at Graham's Creek. This was to be the Plate's home for a few years and the logistics of organizing the event there were frightening. Everything had to be transported: not only food and drink, but a generator and lights, barbecues and eskies, tables and chairs, even the wood for the bonfire.

John had always envisaged hosting the event at the family 'shack' on Wild Cattle Island, with the waters of Colosseum Inlet offering scope and depth for a race. Once renovations on the house there were complete (in 2003) the Pleiades Plate changed venues. Not only were members involved, the race became an item for the Wild Cattle residents who turned out in numbers to assist, observe, and join the festivities.

A pizza oven was constructed and made catering simpler (as well as being a warm place to lean on the colder nights). The menu became soup (either Pea & Ham or Pumpkin) followed by pizza (who can forget the chilli prawn with banana) rounded off by chocolate trophies for all entrants.

The Pleiades Plate itself became a prized trophy and every yacht in the PCSC fleet vied to win it at least once.

In 2006 a second trophy was introduced. A defunct yabby pump was commissioned as the 'coulda been trophy' for the biggest stuff up on the day. RagTop, Immigrant, Pleiades and No Problem have won it in equal measure – they must have been the most frequent competitors!

Sadly John passed away in 2009. He had been diagnosed with cancer during the trip to Sydney in 2000 and eventually it got the better of him. The Plate was run as a harbour race that year and again in 2012. (That was the year when entrants had to compose a poem while sailing to challenge for the trophy.) In the other years, the club fleet was as welcome as ever on Colosseum Inlet.

Pleiades Plate has been a star in the Port Curtis Sailing Club calendar for over ten years. Speaking to Straphanger last month, Helen emphasised how much the family has enjoyed hosting the event and wished us well in our ongoing sailing adventures.


