Marina and her wide angle camera can attest with the thrills and spills captured for us all to see. Club Pacers were well used as Members, and recent start sailing graduates tested their skills. Every week, at least two, sometimes all of the Pacers were on the water and the high vis sails donated by Bechtel are brilliant. Brilliant colours, Brilliant safety, Brilliant photography.

Lady Skipper race on Patron's Day. That was a bit of a buzz for me, I was on the helm of Dr Orders and we crossed the line first.

Sailing followed with Donald Davey Memorial in September, which was a lovely sail around the islands and the Twilight series in January

And a Youth Regatta

We put the word out to our neighbouring sailing clubs that we were hosting the ASP/IBS Youth Regatta, and KBSC responded with a resounding YES. So in October the Youth Regatta was keenly contested between PCSC and KBSC with 6 Sabot sailors (Anna Williams represented us in Iron Gippsland) and 4 Dinghy sailors. Tom Moran and Blake Newton from KBSC were equal first place after day 1 and both won a heat on day 2 however Tom's overall performance gave him the first place position. The family friendly weekend was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone.

When the season started in earnest

Sunday sailing was a hot topic. The view there may be less traffic in the harbour on Sundays, and those members who work 6 days a week could come sailing, so we gave it a try with the Head of the Harbour series in the first half of the season. Honestly it didn't really work, we didn't get any more people come sailing and it created lots of disruption to the Start Sailing program.

So we swapped back to Saturdays and held our championship, handicap, two sprint series, ORC and Fairway races. Periodically the weather gave us some trouble, especially affecting the CQ Championship series which was postponed due to the January flood.

And our first Discover Sailing Fun Day was washed out with a week of rain, but we tried again on the National Discover Sailing Open Day in November. Kids and parents came along, had a great time and came back for the January school holiday program.

Start sailing team have been very busy

Introducing sailing to 21 adults and 13 kids over 6 programs. All in all 25 weeks of getting up early. Looking for ways to improve the program and keep these new sailors coming back, we incorporated a theory evening to the adult program so sailors would have more on water practice. Encourage family participation with parents of children, and children of parents doing our programs. We ran 'catch up' sessions to help the sailors attain the skill level they are aiming for, or invited them to come along again if they wish. Big thanks to our skippers who readily accepted our new sailors on board their yachts for a yacht experience, and everyone who made them welcome around the club.

Supporting our volunteers with training opportunities is another key ingredient and over the year three of our young sailors (Rohan Berry, Anna and Claire Williams) have completed the Assistant Instructor course. Tony Constance joined Colleen in the Instructing.

Credit goes to Martin Cooper who shines as a Sailor Mentor, both on the water, and in the written word. Martin's straphanger Dinghy Hints & Tips are excellent. Thanks Martin.

The "Dash for Cash" is a fun race and they had \$1000 for grabs. Divided between Cats, Monos, and Juniors. The wind at 8-10kt and a big triangle windward, reach, reach. Being beaten by a Sharpie, Skiff, Contender and Tasar over the line.

Jordi Oakley and Ben Miers were also doing well with the new Skiff. They got second place and nearly took the cash home. Also 100 points for the organizer! A very well run regatta, losing nothing to a warm and welcoming social atmosphere.

Port Curtis Sailing Club Inc Strategic Plan

In March and April this year the Management Committee formed a sub group of sailing members to develop a Strategic Plan. The Plan was based on our core objectives from the Constitution:

Core Objectives from constitution:

- To encourage and further the sport of sailing by the promotion of regattas and the giving of prizes and by any other means which may from time to time be determined;
- To foster a spirit of friendship between all sailing fraternities, irrespective of the type or class of their sailing craft;
- To provide and maintain suitable facilities for the storage, launching and maintenance of boats owned by the club; and
- To provide and maintain suitable club rooms and recreation facilities for members in pursuit of the activities listed above.

The sub group determined some audacious goals being:

15-20 years out

All visitors to Port Curtis Sailing Club will be so impressed and feel so welcome that they want to join and sail. The 300 members of the club will:

- Own a 100 berth marina joined by two acres of land
- Host national and state regattas
- Host at least one match race each year

Have access to three full time paid sailing coaches

The club will be seen as a leader in the sailing community and time spent with the club will be acknowledged as a key ingredient in the success of a number of leading sailors.

Within Three Years

Port Curtis Sailing Club will have tenure over a safe waterway. It will have an employed coach who will oversee 20 "learn to sail" sailors. The club will be in a position to provide financial support for young sailors to stay involved and remain active and productive within the club.

Race Briefings

Race briefings will be a focus next season so like previous years, the race briefing will be conducted by the PRO (Principle Race Officer) on the day at an advertised time in the usual area.

Everyone who will be on the water that day must attend the briefing. The briefing is another important avenue to communicate our courses, start/finish lines, travel to/from the course area, shipping and safety procedures. The intention is to be seriously strict with attendance.

Race Nominations

Another area we are tightening up next season is the race nomination paperwork and safety compliance. Rob Auty, our safety audit officer, has provided the following advice to boat owners who wish to race next season.

Yacht Owners need to provide:-

- A copy of your yacht insurance policy confirming public liability (min \$10,000,000) and race risk insurance.
- A copy of your yacht registration certificate from Queensland Transport.
- A copy of completed safety compliance check list as a minimum "YA special regulations equipment audit form Category 7" or a higher category depending in which race you participate (Cat 4 and 5 for Fairway and Tripod)

Dinghy Owners need to:

- Provide a copy of your boat insurance policy confirming public liability (min \$10,000,000).
- Be open to an inspection to ensure safety equipment complies with the YA Special Regulations,
 Part 2 (for Off the Beach Dinghies). See pages 305-310 Racing Rules of Sailing 2013-16.

You should have all documents available when you sign on and pay your fees, otherwise your race nomination cannot be accepted.
