We will keep you informed as to what will happen as information comes to hand.



Jack Mortensen Wheel

For the best senior on handicap on Championship days.

Inaugural Life member, Jack, had a long association with the Club, being instrumental in supervising its construction, as well as being a keen sailor. All sailors see our acknowledgement of his involvement in the Club when they see "MV Jack Mortensen" on the water as our Start Boat.



Craig Armour Fez Award

For the best junior or senior at an away regatta.

The Fez was donated as a perpetual award by Craig's father. After Craig had sailed in a youth laser radical regatta (World's) in Morocco, he bought a Fez, which Alan Armour (father) turned into a trophy. Points are awarded to sailors from a formula adopted by our Club recognising success in International, National or State



Nick Waugh Memorial Trophy

For first on line honours on Championship days.

This award was donated in 2013 by Dave and Jackie Waugh for ten years in memory of their son, Nick.



Wistari Trophy

Calculated as the highest points through all the handicap series over the season. (Aggregate handicap points). This award is sponsored by Scott Patrick.



Sailor of the Year Award

Sailor of the Year award was introduced in 2007 in recognition of an all round contribution to PCSC and the sport of sailing.

This award constitutes more than sailing success, taking into consideration sailing performance in Gladstone, representation of the Club at major away events, as well as the individual's contribution to the Club and the sport of sailing. It can't be awarded to the same person within 10 years.

Nominations are received and the winner is selected by a confidential panel of three members. The award is kept secret until it is presented on Trophy Night.

The award has seen various sponsors over the years starting with the owner/operators of Heron Island sponsoring a trip to the island for a weekend. Unfortunately a change of island ownership resulted in this sponsorship ceasing, and in current times the award has been sponsored by RoadPak Industries with an oversized change for \$500.
