5th & 6th September 2020 Report by Maria Mohrholz (And from my point of sailing)


KBSC in Yeppoon was the host of this year's Impulse Championship.

Forecast for the weekend around 10 knots for both days. My kind of wind :)

The Impulse class had 23 boats with 7 boats flying the PCSC flag.

Racing started at 1pm. Impulses got their own start. Two races for Saturday: triangle, sausage, triangle.

I had a good start, tacked away into clean air and found myself together with the other



Two good races for me with a 12th and 13th in places.

Naomi Young blitz the lot with two minutes ahead of the next boat in the first race. She was too good and got 1st place in both races.

All I had to do was repeat Saturday's performance and I would be happy.

Sunday morning start at 11am and the wind picked up a knot or two: a trapezoid course with two windward returns in the middle for three races.

I tried to push my boat from the beach through the surf. Got swamped.

Tried to get into the boat but didn't get it far enough into the wind.

The next wave got me side on. I tried to get out but stumbled, fell into the water and my boat got washed back to the beach. Bugger!

Kind Arrow sailors picked me up, dusted me off, helped to get my boat into right direction, let me climb in and pushed me into the wind. Thanks guys!!

I had sand everywhere and in my pullies. A bad start and no boat speed. The first race was nothing to crow about.

Ok, room for improvement.

Second race and a good start. Again very close to good sailors where I could match their speed. As my tacks are not the best, I decided on only one tack on the windward leg.

That gave me starboard right to the windward mark.

By the time I got closer to the mark, all the fast boats just got to the mark too. On the rounding I looked behind, and to my surprise, a huge gap to the rest of the fleet. I could hold the fast boats' speed and finished in 12th place again with a minute to spare to the next boat. A great race for me.

Last race got me into 16th place. Not good, and not bad. Overall 13th place. I was over the moon:)

I also got 1st Female prize.

Andy Patrick sailed one of Scott's boats and was sailing very well too.

He was equal points with Naomi Young, but when both had a drop race, Andy ended up with 6 points against Naomi's 8 points and won the Impulse Championship for this year.

AGM Commodore's Report

I would like to take this opportunity to say that it has been a privilege to be your Commodore for this short period. I wish all incoming flag officers and committee members all the very best for this season and for the future

Allboat Regatta at Lake Cootharaba

My first regatta since last year.

This virus really did put a spanner in the works! Now everything has to be Virus safe:

Registration on line, Sailing Instructions on line, no briefing, no socialising.

And they changed the start and finish lines.

Changes to the Sailing Instructions were posted outside the clubhouse.

No one to clarify or ask questions to.



White caps and waves, clouds, and the water had an uninviting brown colour. A cold wind around 17 knots and the water was cold too. Start at 1pm: Triangle, sausage, triangle. Only one other Impulse on the start line and a hard slog to windward, but got rewarded with two fast reaches and the down wind leg was fast too.

When I got to the last bottom mark, I saw the boat and buoy for the new finish line, but everybody ignored it heading upwind to the start line again. I thought that I might have missed something and followed everybody to the start line. It felt funny, so I asked the start boat about the finish line. And "Yes", it was down at the other boat.

Tried to tell the other Impulse, but he could not hear me. So I turned, went down wind to the finish line and back to the start. Got back with only a few seconds to spare for the second race. A fast race and now I knew where the finish was.


It was just on 4pm when we got back to the beach. Cold and wet. Thank goodness for hot showers! Sixth place for the day wasn't so bad. Woodfired pizzas in front of the clubhouse was also just what the doctor ordered.

Talked to Damo (Damian Vanduekom) and his crew from the RL they sailed. They had made the same mistake with the finish line too!

The bar closed at 8pm, and everyone went to their camp. The wind had completely stopped. It was so quiet at the lake and even a possum came down from the tree, practising social distancing.

Three races for Sunday: one before lunch, two after lunch. Light wind, very shifty and gusty. Cats passing on both sides, trailer sailors, and small yachts taking your starboard and wind.

One cat capsized in front of me. No choice - ran over the mast. Big scratch in my centreboard and the location pin in my rudder bent so much I could not raise the rudder and had to capsize the boat coming back to the beach.



The wind and action on the water didn't change in the two afternoon races. Cold and wet, but still an ok weekend sailing. 10th place overall from 19 boats.
